# Confidence Booster Answer Keys

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- Instead of having students always be A or B, have them switch for every other Confidence Booster. This will allow them to take turns starting the conversations in Part 2.
- If some pairs finish quickly, have them personalize the material while waiting. For example, for Confidence Booster 29–32, have them take turns asking and answering questions about their personal activities for the current week.
- To challenge students, have them create one or more conversations using some or all of the responses they didn't use in Part 2. For example, for Confidence Booster 29–32, students could use the responses (underlined below) to make the following conversation.

A: You won't believe what I did this weekend. I went bungee jumping!

B: That's fantastic!

A: Yeah, bungee jumping was exciting. But then I fell while I was waiting in line for my friend to try it.

B: How awful. Are you OK?

A: Yeah, but I'm going to a museum next weekend. Waiting in line can be dangerous!
